

MODIFIED ENHANCED BEHAVIORAL HEALTH POLICIES AND TELEMEDICINE AND TELEPSYCHIATRY POLICIES

Effective today, Monday, March 30, 2020, N.C. DHHS is temporarily modifying enhanced behavioral health policies and telemedicine and telepsychiatry policies to better enable the delivery of remote care to individuals served using both Medicaid and non-Medicaid funds during the COVID-19 outbreak. This will include dates of service on or after March 10, 2020, and will remain in effect until the state of emergency is declared over or when this policy is rescinded.

FOLLOW-UP FROM MARCH 27 Q&A WEBINAR FOR VAYA PROVIDERS – CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF AND ECONOMIC SECURITY (CARES) ACT

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act, which provides federal government aid related to COVID-19, was signed into law on March 27, 2020. Providers Council brought attention to several CARES Act provisions relevant to providers, including state unemployment insurance.
