

Why?

- Nearly 25% of adults in the United States have a mental health or substance use disorder (i.e., behavioral health condition
- These adults consume almost 40% of all cigarettes smoked by adults in the United States
- People with behavioral health conditions die about five years earlier than people without such conditions, more than 50% from tobacco-attributable diseases.



On Your Radar

• NCDHHS launched the new <u>Healthy Opportunities Pilot (HOP)</u> this week, May 15, 2024, for NC Medicaid Direct beneficiaries who are eligible for Tailored Care Management (TCM).

• Link to Provider Communication Bulletin 2023-2024 Issue 57 (May 13, 2024).

• **HOP** is the nation's first comprehensive program to test and evaluate the impact of providing evidence-based, non-medical interventions related to housing, food, transportation, and interpersonal safety and toxic stress to eligible Medicaid beneficiaries.

- To qualify for **HOP**, beneficiaries must:
 - Be eligible for TCM.
 - Have at least one qualifying physical or behavioral health condition, and one qualifying social risk factor as <u>defined by NCDHHS</u>.
 - Reside in a county that is participating in the pilot.

- The following counties in Vaya's region are participating:
 - Avery, Buncombe, Cherokee, Clay, Graham, Haywood, Henderson, Jackson, Macon,
 Madison, McDowell, Mitchell, Polk, Swain, Transylvania, and Yancey

• The **HOP** Network Lead for these counties is <u>Impact Health</u>.

HOP will cover the cost of 29 interventions defined and priced in the NCDHHS <u>Hop Service</u>
 Fee Schedule.

• Providers can refer members who could potentially benefit from **HOP** services by contacting the member's care manager or calling Vaya's Member and Recipient Service Line at **1-800-962-9003**, available *7 a.m.-6 p.m., Monday-Saturday, including holidays*.

Service and Authorization Updates

Delayed Implementation: Substance Use Waiver Services (State-funded)

NCDHHS has announced the following new or amended *State-funded services* will not promulgate May 1, 2024, as previously indicated:

- Substance Use Intensive Outpatient Program (SAIOP)
- Substance Use Comprehensive Outpatient Treatment (SACOT)
- Ambulatory Withdrawal Management with/without Extended Onsite Monitoring (ASAM 1 WM and 2 WM)
- Clinically Managed Residential Withdrawal Management (ASAM 3.2 WM)
- Medically Monitored Intensive Withdrawal Management (ASAM 3.7 WM)

Delayed Implementation of Substance Use Waiver Services (State-funded)

- With the exception of the new *State-funded* Ambulatory Withdrawal Management with Extended Onsite Monitoring Service, the services listed on the previous slide will continue to be available.

- NCDHHS has not yet announced a new implementation date for these services.

Postponed: Updated Medicaid 1915(b) Non-Clinician Standard Rate Increases

- *NC Medicaid* has announced the following clinical coverage policies (CCPs) will not promulgate on May 1, 2024, as previously indicated:
 - Substance Use Intensive Outpatient Program (SAIOP)
 - Substance Use Comprehensive Outpatient Treatment (SACOT)
 - Ambulatory Withdrawal Management with/without Extended Onsite Monitoring (ASAM 1 WM and 2 WM)
 - Clinically Managed Residential Withdrawal Management (ASAM 3.2 WM)
 - Medically Monitored Intensive Withdrawal Management (ASAM 3.7 WM)

Postponed: Updated Medicaid 1915(b) Non-Clinician Standard Rate Increases

- The existing *Medicaid* SAIOP, SACOT, Ambulatory Withdrawal Management without Extended Onsite Monitoring, and Medically Monitored Intensive Withdrawal Management will continue to be available under the current NC Medicaid Clinical Coverage Policy (CCP) 8A.
- This delay will also postpone the proposed rate changes announced in <u>Provider Communication Bulletin</u> 2023-2024 Issue 54 (April 30, 2024).

Postponed: Updated Medicaid 1915(b) Non-Clinician Standard Rate Increases

- Vaya has updated our standard rate schedules to reflect these changes on the <u>Rate and Checkwrite</u>
 <u>Schedules</u> page of our <u>Provider Central</u> website.
- At this time, NC Medicaid has not announced when the new/revised CCPs will promulgate.
