NC Medicaid Updated Flexibilities for Hurricane Helene

NCDHHS updated the Hurricane Helene flexibilities after announcing the Public Health Emergency for Helene will end Dec. 25, 2024. Most flexibilities now expire Dec. 25, 2024, instead of Dec. 31, 2024. However, flexibilities tied to the 1915(c) waivers (CAP/C, CAP/DA, and NC Innovations Waiver) will remain in place until June 30, 2025.

1915(b)(3) Services to Sunset Dec. 31, 2024

Per NCDHHS, all b(3) services are scheduled to sunset Dec.31, 2024, and will no longer be available. Members receiving b(3) services have transitioned to 1915(i) services already or are in the process of moving over. The member's care manager or care coordinator must complete and submit the independent assessment to Carelon for eligibility determination before the member can begin accessing 1915(i) services.
