Mental Health First Aid May 13, 2025, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

Vaya and Buncombe County Health and Human Services will offer free, in-person Mental Health First Aid training at Vaya's administrative office, 200 Ridgefield Court, Suite 218, Asheville, NC 28806. This eight-hour training will teach participants how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental health and substance use challenges, as well as build skills to provide initial support to someone who may be developing a behavioral health concern or crisis by connecting them to care.

CHW Integration: Strategies for Impact and Sustainability

This two-part webinar series focuses on advancing and sustaining Community Health Worker (CHW) integration across North Carolina's health care system. Hosted by the North Carolina Area Health Education Centers (NC AHEC), the North Carolina Community Health Worker Association, and Freedmen's Consulting, this series will explore strategies to strengthen CHW programs, align them with value-based care models, and support long-term sustainability through practical financing approaches.

These sessions are designed for CHWs, community-based organizations, health care practices, care management agencies, health system population health teams, and health plans. NC Medicaid is sponsoring the event at no cost to participants.

ECHO Opioid and Pain Management Program May 22 – July 10, 2025 | 11 a.m. – 12 p.m. Thursdays

The ECHO Opioid and Pain Management program provides free, virtual training on pain management, opioid prescribing risks, and overdose prevention. This six-week, case-based curriculum aims to train clinicians in primary care pain management strategies, including non-opioid and non-pharmacological treatment options, substance use screening, risk reduction counseling, and tapering strategies for opioids and benzodiazepines.

Target audiences include doctors, advanced practice providers, pharmacists, and nurses. Attendees are eligible to receive free continuing education credits. Register online. Permanent Supported Housing Training June 10 – 13, 2025, 9 a.m. – 1:30 p.m.

Permanent Supported Housing (PSH) virtual training provides an interactive learning experience that focuses on identifying and understanding the phases of tenancy for individuals transitioning from homelessness and institutional care. A total of 16 hours of instruction are divided into four half-day sessions. Participants engage in lectures, discussions, and small group activities geared toward acquiring and exercising skills to help individuals understand their motivation and readiness for change and foster successful independent living.

PSH training was initially developed for Assertive Community Treatment and Community Support Team providers, and registration is prioritized for these professionals. However, other attendees are welcome. Capacity is limited to 25 people.
