New Peer Support Policies Go Live

New policies and procedures for the <u>North Carolina Certified Peer Support Specialist</u> (CPSS) program launch July 15, 2025, following input from more than 100 CPSS professionals, national organizations, and state providers.

Key policy changes include:

- New Ethics and Code of Conduct
- Eligibility: 18 months in recovery required before training
- Trainers: Must have three or more years of CPSS experience
- Certification Exam: Now required after completing the state's Foundations of Peer Support

training

Training updates:

- Online course launches July 2025
- In-person training starts September 2025
- Full certification requires completion of both trainings and passing the exam

Trainer applications:

- Open early July 2025
- Selected applicants will be notified by the end of July 2025

Person-Centered Thinking Training Sept. 11-12, 2025, 9 a.m.–4 p.m.

This free, in-person training opportunity is a two-day, 12-hour workshop in Asheville that introduces the principles and use of person-centered thinking (PCT). Vaya trainers will review and discuss the origins, research, and values of PCT. This training will provide an essential framework for effectively supporting a person in navigating life's challenges and opportunities.

Participants must attend and participate on both days to receive a certificate of completion. Each day will include a lunch break. Participants will receive the training handouts two weeks prior to

the event. Only three individuals from each provider organization may register, and attendance is capped at 15 attendees.
