Hurricane Helene Recovery: New App to Find WNC Resources

A new app is connecting western North Carolina residents to resources to help them rebuild after Hurricane Helene. The Project Your Home app, available on the <u>Apple App</u> and <u>Google Play</u> stores, lists comprehensive resources for emergency shelter, law enforcement, food and water, construction materials, and other community supports, including <u>Hope4NC</u> mental health services.

The Project Your Home App is provided by the <u>Project Your Home</u> organization, which works to provide immediate housing solutions for displaced families and offers resources and assistance to help families navigate recovery. NC Medicaid Coverage Change for GLP-1 Weight Management

Medications

Effective Oct. 1, 2025, NC Medicaid will discontinue coverage of GLP-1s for weight loss, including Saxenda, Wegovy, and Zepbound. These medications will continue to be covered for the indications of reduction in cardiovascular death, heart attack, and stroke in obese adults with cardiovascular disease, noncirrhotic metabolic dysfunction-associated steatohepatitis (MASH), and severe obstructive sleep apnea (OSA). These medications will also be available under the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment (EPSDT) benefit for members under age 21 if medical necessity is demonstrated. There will be no changes to coverage for GLP-1 medications for the treatment of diabetes.

All current prior authorizations will no longer be valid after Sept. 30, 2025. Providers must obtain a new prior authorization for qualifying members beginning Oct. 1, 2025.

Before submitting your form, please ensure you:

- Use the correct version.
- Include your signature and the date.
- Include the member's correct birthdate.
- Note the coverage quarter.
- Select all checkboxes (or mark "Not applicable").
- Complete the grid (if your organization has an authorization to provide a service during any portion of the quarter).

National Suicide Prevention Week

Gov. Josh Stein has proclaimed Sept. 7-13, 2025, as <u>National Suicide Prevention Week</u> in North Carolina. On Sept. 8, the <u>state celebrated the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline</u> and the second anniversary of the availability of American Sign Language services through the lifeline.

The <u>988 Lifeline</u> launched in July 2022, offering free, one-on-one assistance from judgment-free counselors for anyone experiencing a mental health crisis. From June 2024 through May 2025, 988 in North Carolina averaged more than 11,500 contacts (call, text, or chat) per month.

In May 2025, the center received more than 13,300 contacts, including almost 3,000 from people

who identified as veterans and more than 200 from Spanish-speaking individuals. A recent survey found one in three North Carolina callers to 988 say the service saved their life or someone else's life. Learn more on the North Carolina 988 Performance Dashboard.

Permanent Supportive Housing Training Sept. 23-24, 2025, 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m.

This free, online training enhances Community Support Team (CST) and Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) providers' understanding of the Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) model. This training prioritizes ACT and CST providers, but other attendees are welcome.

To receive training credit, providers must attend and participate (via camera and audio) both days. Providers in the Vaya, Alliance Health, and Partners Health Management regions may register up to three staff from each agency. Attendance is capped at 25 participants.
